Approximately half the sessions are held outside, with interactive class time and projects in air-conditioned Education Station. Campers will need comfortable, cool clothing and shoes; hats, sunglasses, sunscreen each day. Class size will not exceed 20. Tuition for each camper each session is \$75 members; \$90 non-members.
