



## 'Nature's Brush Strokes' art exhibition now open at South Texas Botanical Gardens on Brennecke Nature Trail

CORPUS CHRISTI—South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center added a new 'stroke' to its April 2 BIG BLOOM mega Plant Sale and Dollar Day. As if the event—with hundreds of stunning plants, butterfly and lady bug releases, parrot talks, reptile shows, wetland birding scopes and vendors—didn't already boast enough color, 'Nature's Brush Strokes,' thirty-pieces of original vertical full-color art depicting South Texas wildflowers and native plants by area artists, opened that day on the Mary Hope Brennecke Nature Trail. Funded by Hotel Occupancy Tax Funds by the City of Corpus Christi through the Arts & Cultural Commission, and sponsor **Joyce Barnette**, the exhibit will be open through September 30.

Ninety eligible works were submitted for the juried competition. Artists photographed their original pieces in high resolution, submitting digital images which could be enlarged to 30 by 60-inch reproductions on vinyl mounted on dibond, the final weather-resistant products attached to custom-made two-sided art "pillars" along the trail. Each artist could submit up to three entries, with the winning 30 awarded \$200 each.
